Dress Code Policy

Skirts, Shorts, Dresses and Pants must be fitted at the waist and must be at a minimum to the knee area in length. NOTE: As a rule of thumb parents may use a dollar bill, held sideways, for a measurement of no more than 2 ½ inches from the crease at the back of the knee. All pants, including jeans must be traditional style without cutouts or holes and without excessive ornamentation. They must be fitted at the waist and must not be baggy or oversized or undersized and not dragging the floor. Leggings are considered an accessory and are to be covered by the appropriate length skirt, dress or other garment. Refer to the Richmond County School Policy, located in the Code of Student Conduct and Discipline Handbook. Rule#14.

School Hours

A friendly reminder - Breakfast begins at 7:45am. Please do not drop off your students before this time. All car riders should be dropped off in the car round each morning. Please help keep the car line moving by having your student ready to exit as your car approaches the appropriate drop off station on the curb. Please follow the directions of the staff located in the parking lot. Please do not drop students off in the faculty parking lot. Breakfast is served at 7:45 and ends at 8:00, students that arrive after 8:00 should report to their classroom.

The instructional school day begins at 8:15 and ends at 3:15. Students who arrive after 8:15 will be considered tardy. Any students who are picked up before 3:15 will also be marked tardy.
