Built in 1964, Clifford T. Sego is one of the oldest middle schools in Richmond County. Clifford T. Sego, the educational figure from which Sego Middle takes its name, served as a teacher, principal and assistant superintendent in Richmond County. Sego's mission and vision is to provide a safe learning environment that will allow all students the opportunity to succeed academically, socially, and produce effective citizens by combining character education, technology, discipline and the community. Sego will continue to bridge the gap between the school and the community. Sego Middle School is a family of caring, contributing individuals with a passion for learning.

## General Information

We are providing challenging, academic and extracurricular programs this school year. Additional programs offered to our students: STEM Power After School 6th Grade Girls Club – Meetings build communication, teamwork and communication skills. Also fostering critical and analytical thinking through STEM problem-based learning. Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) Program – Develops learning, study and academic behavioral skills that are essential to success in rigorous coursework. AVID classes prepare students for college and career readiness. Teachers As Advisors Program – Classroom guidance to address academic, social growth, career/post- secondary development of all students. Positive Behavioral Intervention & Support (PBIS) – Provides school-wide discipline needs and addresses individual student needs.

## College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
