Welcome Parents, School Staff, and Community Members

Barton Chapel Elementary receives money from Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act. This law provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to school systems based on high numbers or percentages of children who meet certain financial criteria. These funds are provided to help ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to succeed in school by meeting the challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards."

Purpose of Meeting

"The federal law requires that each school system receiving "Title I, Part A funds" jointly develop with parents and stakeholders of all participating children. Assistance is requested in planning our family engagement activities and specifically in revising district and school policies, School Improvement Plan, School-Parent Compact, Building Staff Capacity (determining what training our staff needs to promote good school-family partnerships, and determining how best to spend our family engagement funds).

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Barton Chapel Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement in an effort to support student learning. Barton Chapel Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Barton Chapel Elementary values and experiment engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Barton Chapel Elementary School invited all parents to attend an input/revision meeting at the end of the 2021-2022 school year to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school-wide plan, our school-parent compared and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Barton Chapel Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents of students with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is shared with parents at the annual meeting. The plan will also be posted on the school web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2022–2023 District Goab During the 2022-23 school year, we will utilize technology and the Richmood County School System Instructorial Framework to increase academic achievement across all seaded content areas by 3%. During the 2022-23 school year, through our induction Support Program, we will increase the percentised Support Program, we will increase the percentise of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in the Bichmood Courter School System to 28%.

 During the 2022-23 school year, we will increase the graduation rate from 73.77% to 75% by a continued focus on the strategy map and working to produce graduates that meet the Richmond County School System Profile of a Graduate.





TITLE I FUNDS

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Set Aside:

Each district receiving more than \$500,000 in Title I Part A Funds is required to reserve **at least one percent** of its Title I funds to carry out parent and family engagement activities, including those described in the written policy section below. **Ninety (90) percent** of these "setaside" funds must be distributed to schools, with priority given to "high-need" schools. School Improvement Plan

Barton Chapel Elementary annually evaluates the schoolwide plan using data from the State's assessments, other student performance data, and perception data to determine if the schoolwide program has been effective in addressing the major problem areas and, in turn, increasing student achievement, particularly for the lowestachieving students. Schools must annually revise the plan, as necessary, based on student needs and the results of the evaluation to ensure continuous improvement. (ESEA section 1114(b)(3); 34 C.F.R. § 200.26(c)).



School Improvement Plan Input

School Goals:

Initiative 1: (READING)

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, the number of students scoring on or above grade level in reading on the i-Ready EOY diagnostic assessment will increase by 20% as compared to the EOY i-Ready diagnostic assessment of Spring, 2022.

Initiative 2: (MATH)

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, the number of students scoring on or above grade level in math on the IReady EOY diagnostic assessment will increase by 20%.

Initiative 3: (Culture & Climate)

During the 2022-2023 school year, BCES will decrease the number of discipline incidences by 10% from 45 incidences to 40 incidences by using professional and school counseling, therapy services, PBIS model, motivational practices, and social emotional learning activities.
