Social Service Referrals

Success Center staff can assist students and families coordinate services, resources and the referral process for local community agencies serving students and their families.

Food Market

Behavioral Health Services

Offers students individual counselors through a number of providers that collaborate with the Richmond County School System. Students can self-refer or be referred by a friend, parent, teacher or community member with concerns about a student. The Success Center also offers small group counseling based on needs that students request.
