COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Band This performance-based class focuses on basic instrumental skill development and music reading. The goal of this class is to teach students the proper way to hold and play a brass, percussion or woodwind instrument with the characteristic tone quality of the instrument. Students can elect to play their instrument of choice with the band director's approval and recommendation. Participation in concert performances outside of the regular class hours is required. In addition to large group ensembles, individual growth and achievement are encouraged through participation in solo and ensemble festivals, district honor bands and private lessons. *Participation in concert performances outside of regular class hours is required.*

Chorus This performance-based class focuses on learning to use the vocal instrument to create a healthy and pleasing sound. In addition to learning proper vocal production and technique, students learn music reading skills, sight-singing skills, and performance skills. Students sing literature with and without accompaniment in up to three parts. Chorus offers opportunities for students to develop team building and leadership skills. *Participation in concert performances outside of regular class hours is required.*

Students who successfully complete 7th and 8th grade Band/Chorus (consecutively) in Middle School are eligible to receive 1 High School credit. Students must complete each year with passing grades.

For grading purposes, all music students are required to produce and present quality work in **one or more** of the following formats:

- Public performances
- Visual displays such as poster boards and tri-folds
- Audio and/or video recordings (CD, mp3, DVD)
- Web-based presentations such as blog entries and web site content

ATTENDANCE:

Students are responsible for making up any missed work. Students will have 4 days to submit make-up assignments. Any work submitted after those 4 days will not be accepted. Student study groups will be established at the beginning of the semester to provide additional support. Students who are not in their seats at the scheduled time-whether they are in or out of the classroom -will be marked TARDY unless they have a pass from another teacher or administrator. Parents will be contacted if their child is excessively tardy (more than 3 times per nine weeks).

- Become life-long learners and lovers of music as consumers, performers, creators or teachers.

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:

Upon entering classroom:

- Take out all instruments and/or materials needed at the start of class. Immediately begin working on "Do Now" activities and warm-up lessons, unless otherwise instructed.
- Sharpening pencils should take place at the beginning of class. If pencils need to be sharpened, the class helper will at one time collect all pencils when instructed.

Restroom Passes:

• For safety and security, students are allowed restroom opportunity prior to the start of class and at the conclusion of class unless an alteration is made in the schedule. Accommodations will be made for students with doctor's notes only.

Make-up Lessons:

• If a student misses a lesson, that student will have the opportunity to make up their work by scheduling an appointment with Ms. Burns. It is the responsibility of the student to manage their time appropriately and make arrangements for completion.

Classroom Journals/Folders/Music Books

• All journals, folders and music books are located on the Student Workstation upon entering the classroom. All journals/folders/music books may be gathered at the beginning of class and returned at the end of class upon exiting.

Upon exiting classroom:

• After all items are completely packed and all materials placed in their proper location, students will line up to the right of the door exiting in an orderly manner with appropriate volume.
