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What does my score mean?

On a first grade report card, students receive a score of 1-4 for each standard that is assessed. You will also see this score on many of their assignments. Below is a scale that explains the meaning of each number. Please go over this with your child so he/she will understand their scores on school work and report cards. Thank you!

4	If I score a 4 this means I exceed the grade level expectations and can apply what I have learned with deeper meaning. I am going above and beyond the standard/skill and considered a distinguished learner.
3	If I score a 3 this means I understand and can apply what I have learned. I am meeting the standard/skill and considered proficient.
2	If I score a 2 this means I understand most of the standards /skills. I make minor mistakes and still need a little practice with the teacher in small groups and my peers. I am considered an emerging/developing learner.
1	If I score a 1 this means I have little to no understanding of the standards/skill. I should ask more questions. I am a beginning learner with this standard/skill.
