

MoID Class 2024 – 2025 Syllabus

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Course Description and Objectives

Moderately Intellectually Disabled (MOID) is a special education program for students with cognitive disabilities. The purpose and mission of this class is to prepare the students for life after high school. Helping them to develop independent living skills, including self-advocacy skills. While also facilitating students to increase life skills that can transition successfully into work experiences and career skills that lead to gainful employment for the future.

The main objective for the MOID class is to incorporate grade level appropriate activities for all subject areas. While also addressing student's deficits in adaptive behaviors, communication, vocational, motor, and social skills. Creating a cohesive learning environment that allows for ALL students to learn and thrive. Extra help is available everyday through one-on-one help from a teacher or paraprofessional until a concept is mastered. Emphasis will be placed on successful completion the Georgia Alternative Assessment (GAA 2.0) for 11th grade students. Work completion is greatly encouraged.

Absences and Assignments

A doctor's or parent's excuse must be presented to the teacher upon returning to school. Teacher or paraprofessional will provide student with missed work for completion and submission.

Course Assessment Plan/Grading Scale

This course will include many formative and summative assessments, labs, and homework.

Classroom Consequences: (positive and negative consequences)

Classroom management will be handled using a positive reinforcement system. They will earn token money for various throughout the day, such as, bringing homework folder, following directions, positive attitude, etc.

- 1. Quiet Time
- 2. Loss of Preferred Activity Time
- 3. Lunch Detention
- 4. Call to Parent / Meeting with Parent
