- ⇒ **Survey your students' levels of online access**. Differentiate your content and course specific materials for your students' **diverse digital needs**. If needed, consider a project-based assignment or non-digital assignments. Provide related rubrics and assignment expectations prior to the start of our Distance Learning Days.
- ⇒ **Refer to the <u>RCSS Distance Learning Webpage</u>** as a resource. It contains planning resources for you and information for your parents and students. Link it to your webpage and show students where they can locate it.
- ⇒ **Gather the tools you will need in order to provide instruction from home.** Contact your media specialist if you need to check out a laptop or additional resources.
