GRADUATION REHEARSAL

Rehearsal will be **Tuesday, May 26th at 9:00 a.m.** and last until we get it right! This is extremely important and will be the only rehearsal; therefore, it is MANDATORY! This means you should not schedule a beach trip, picnics at the lake, etc.

GRADUATION DAY

Graduation is Wednesday, May 27 at the James Brown Arena. Every graduate needs to be dressed in cap and gown by 5:30p.m. The ceremony will begin promptly at 6:30p.m. Please remember you will be driving downtown in traffic with the possibility of being stopped by a train. Please leave your house accordingly. There are no tardies at graduation. If you are late, you will not walk the stage.

If you owe money for lost textbooks, library books, uniforms, or anything else, you MUST pay all fines, before graduation!

DRESS CODE FOR GRADUATION

Young Ladies-

- Dress should not fall below the hem of the gown.
- Black dress shoes. Shoes that are not acceptable: flip flops, clogs, shower shoes, tennis shoes.
- Absolutely no facial jewelry/ piercings. (This means no nose, lip, cheek, or eyebrow piercings.)
- No "big" hair. The cap needs to fit tightly on the top of the head.
- No big earrings-small studs only. You may change as soon as graduation is over.

Young Men-

- · Black or navy pants
- Black dress shoes. Shoes that are not acceptable: flip flops, sandals, clogs, boots, tennis shoes.
- White dress shirt with a navy or black tie should be worn.
- Absolutely no earrings or facial jewelry/piercings. (This means no nose, lip, cheek, or eyebrow piercings.)

Everyone-

Please take note of all of these requirements. People have been pulled out of line before the ceremony for not being dressed appropriately. Do not take a chance on this happening.

RCSS Graduate Reminders for the Class of 2020:

- Graduates will enter through the security entrance on the 8th street side of the arena
- ✓ Dresses/skirts should not be longer than the graduation gown.
- Caps should be place squarely on top of heads. No writing/added decoration will be allowed on the caps.
- Caps will not be thrown at the end of the ceremony.
- Cell phones are to be in the off position. We prefer that cell phones are not on the stage at all.
- No attention seeking behaviors while walking across stage to receive diploma covers.

- ✓ Please remember that students will receive diploma covers ONLY as they walk across the stage. Upon the completion of a successful graduation, students will be eligible to go downstairs to pick up diplomas before leaving JBA.
- ✓ The JBA does not allow balloons or noise makers such as air horns and bells in the arena area.
- Male students will remove caps before presentation of colors and will return caps to head after the pledge and the color guard has exited the arena.
- Graduates will not chew gum or eat candy while on the arena floor or while on stage.
