

The Richmond County Board of Education (RCBOE) holds committee and regular meetings open to the public throughout the year.

### **Historic Improvements to Graduation Rate**

The Class of 2024 marked a historic achievement with a 3.7% increase in the four-year graduation rate, reaching 81.7% — the highest on record for the district.

### **College and Career Readiness Up Across All Schools**

Our school system grew in every category of the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI). CCRPI is Georgia's accountability system for K-12 schools that measures academic achievement and college and career readiness.

#### **District ACT Scores Rose by 3%**

Our school system saw significant improvement in its 2024 ACT composite score, rising from 18.1 in 2023 to 19.5 at a 3% gain across high schools. More than 160 students took the test in the 2024 cohort and achieved the second-highest ACT composite score in the school system's history.

#### Class of 2025 Graduates Earn More than \$41 Million in Scholarships

Class of 2025 spring graduates earned more than \$41.6 million in scholarships this year, highlighting their determination, talent, and hard work. Nearly 1,800 graduates crossed the Bell Auditorium stage during commencement exercises held from May 28–30, 2025.



## BUS TRANSPORTATION:

If your child(ren) needs school bus transportation for the 2025–2026 school year, registration is required, even if they've ridden the bus before. 



### **Jerette Hurst**

still finds joy in the small things— a smile from a student, a heartfelt thank-you, or helping a student feel safe and well. This



"I was actually shocked and amazed to hear that I was being acknowledged for my work," said Hurst on receiving the news. "Going about my day-to-day activities and knowing someone appreciates it—it gave me a sense of pride."

Hurst's path to school nursing started in the U.S. Army, where she served as a nurse before retiring in 2018. Wanting to continue giving back, she joined RCSS and now serves both W.S. Hornsby Elementary and Middle Schools. Each day, she manages everything from daily medications and chronic conditions to emotional crises and scraped knees.

One of her most memorable moments this year involved recognizing the symptoms of asthma in a student with no prior diagnosis. Her quick action and follow-up led to the student receiving treatment and returning to learning. "She came back to school about two days later, and thanked me for helping her feel better," said Hurst. "Just a simple thank you from her and knowing that I made her feel better reaffirmed my commitment to the students."

Hurst believes deeply in the link between health and learning. "Healthier students are happier students, and they learn better too," she said. "The role of the school nurse is to ensure that all students have the same opportunity academically."

Hurst credits her fellow school nurses for inspiring her growth, citing their diverse medical backgrounds and strong support system. Her advice for anyone considering school nursing: "Have a passion to make a positive impact on a person's life."



Her favorite part of the job, is helping students broaden their horizons.


"I try to help my students develop a love for reading and learning by talking with them about books, encouraging


