What is it?

How is it revised?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Glenn Hills Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook and given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in September before the scheduled Open House event. The plan is on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

Glenn Hills Elementary 2025-2026 School Improvement Plan Goals

- 1. During the 2025-2026 school year our teachers will score an overall 3 in the areas of equitable learning, high expectations, supportive learning, and active learning.
- 2. By May 2026, 40% of 3rd 5th grade students will score proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Reading Assessment.
- 3. By May 2026, 45% of 3rd-5th grade students will score proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment.
