School Plan for Shared Student Achievement



What is it?

This is a plan that describes how **Jenkins-White Elementary** will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. **Jenkins-White Elementary** values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that **Jenkins-White Elementary** will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Jenkins-White Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. **Jenkins-White Elementary** will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and front office.

2024-2025 District Goals

*During the 24-25 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.

*During the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

*During the 24-25 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.

2024-2025 JWES Goals

JWES will increase through differentiated professional learning, teachers will have multiple opportunities to improve their instructional systems by May 2025, as measured by 5% increases in TKES performance standards at Level III: Instructional Planning (58% to 63%) and Instructional Strategies (75% to 80%).

At least 5% (from 317 to 301) of our students will respond to our tiered intervention supports for behavior and SEL as evidenced by our office referrals and spotlight data analysis during the 2024-2025 school year 75% to 80%.

By May 2025, the percentage of students that score within the grade level stretch band on Georgia Milestones Assessment will increase by 3 percent. To include 3rd grade 12.4 to 15.4, 4th grade 14.4 to 17.4 and 5th grade 21.25 to 24.25.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, JW Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an *agreement* that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers on a survey. The

School-parent compact is are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.


Parent and Family Engagement Standards
