

Start Strong SAFETY PLAN

Our priority is the safety of our students, staff, and community. Our safety plan is based on the recommendations of the Georgia Department of Education and public health officials to **keep students learning with us in the safest learning environment that we can provide.** Guidance may change as new information and recommendations are available.



FACIAL COVERINGS & HYGIENE

- RCSS Staff and students are required to wear a facial covering during transitions and in common areas where social distancing and contact tracing are difficult.
- Hand sanitizer is readily available throughout all school buildings.
- All students and staff will be encouraged to sanitize when they enter and before they leave each day.
- Students and staff will be allotted time to frequently wash their hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.



TRANSPORTATION

- All students are required to wear a facial covering.
- Buses will be disinfected after each route.
- Students will be expected to use provided hand sanitizer upon entry and exiting the bus.
- Parents are encouraged to pick up/drop off their student, if possible, to decrease the number of students on school buses.



SOCIAL DISTANCING



HEALTH PROTOCOLS

- Staff and students who are sick should stay at home.
- Health services staff will evaluate any student or staff member showing symptoms of COVID-19.
- Any student with a temperature above 100.0 degrees will be sent home.
- Students/staff will be sent home if they exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 based on CDC guidance that are not otherwise explained.
- Time based return to school/ work strategy as recommended by the CDC.

- Students will be grouped together to minimize cross-contamination throughout the day.
- Desks will be arranged in a way that allows for the most social distancing possible in the space provided.
- Outdoor spaces will be utilized when possible.
- Parents are expected to drop off students in the car line as visitors inside the building will be restricted.
- Field trips, assemblies, and large gatherings will be modified to meet social distancing guidance.

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, the Richmond County Health department and parents will be notified. CDC Guidelines will be followed for cleaning and return to school/ work.
