Description:

British Literature and Composition is designed to help the student improve writing skills, critical thinking skills, vocabulary skills, and reading skills. Literary focus will be placed on short stories, nonfiction literary works, novels, plays, and poems. Emphasis will also be placed on essay writing as preparation for college and career as well as critical reading/thinking skills for the SAT.

<u>Instructional Philosophy:</u> The overarching expectation in this class is creating a positive learning environment where all students feel safe and have equitable opportunities to show their knowledge, master the standards, and take ownership of their learning experience.

Expectations

Absent: If you are absent, it is the student's responsibility to go into Canvas to learn what he or she must make up.
