Only Seniors receiving honors recognition should attend this event. Seniors being recognized will receive an invitation.

FROM GUIDANCE

Students Not Meeting Graduation Requirements -- Mrs. Farrer will make all final telephone calls after final exams and final grades have been submitted by the teachers by Friday, May 14th. Students receiving this telephone call will be unable to participate in the graduation rehearsal or ceremony. Please be mindful of your grades and attendance; each day is important.

<u>Graduation Day Recognitions</u> -- Deadline for Scholarships to Guidance – Friday, May 21. You should submit copies of original letters, e-mails, or college account information to Mrs. Frazier in the Guidance Office. Final Transcript Request --- Students are responsible for completing their FINAL TRANSCRIPT REQUEST with Mrs. Frazier, the Guidance Secretary. Request will be taken April 26 - May 25. Students must also PAY \$2.00 to have their FINAL TRANSCRIPT request processed for out-of-state schools.

GRADUATION REHEARSAL

Rehearsal will be **Thursday**, **May 27th at 9:00 a.m.** and last <u>until we get it right!</u> This is extremely important and will be the only rehearsal; therefore, it is **MANDATORY!** This means you should not schedule a beach trip, picnics at the lake, etc.

- No "big" hair. The cap needs to fit tightly on the top of the head.
- No big earrings-small studs only. You may change as soon as graduation is over.

Young Men-

- Black or navy pants
- Black dress shoes. Shoes that are not acceptable: flip flops, sandals, clogs, boots, tennis shoes.
- White dress shirt with a navy or black tie should be worn.
- Absolutely no facial jewelry or piercings. (This means no nose, lip, cheek, or eyebrow piercings.)

Everyone-

Please take note of all of these requirements. People have been pulled out of line before the ceremony for not being dressed appropriately. Do not take a chance on this happening.

Also, no glitter, paint, etc. on the cap or gown.

RCSS Graduate Reminders for the Class of 2021:

- Dresses/skirts should not be longer than the graduation gown.
- Caps should be place squarely on top of heads. No writing/added decoration will be allowed on the caps.
- Caps will not be thrown at the end of the ceremony.
- Cell phones are to be in the off position. We prefer that cell phones are not on the stage at all.
- No attention seeking behaviors while walking across stage to receive diploma covers.
- ✓ Please remember that students will receive diploma covers ONLY as they walk across the stage. Upon the completion of a successful graduation, students will be eligible to go downstairs to pick up diplomas before leaving JBA.
- ✓ RCSS not allow balloons or noise makers such as air horns and bells in the stadium.
- Male students will remove caps before presentation of colors and will return caps to head after the pledge and the color guard has exited the arena.
- ✓ Graduates will not chew gum or eat candy while in the stadium or while on stage.
