## **Course Description and Objectives**

The sixth grade ELA course aims to enhance students' reading, writing, speaking, listening, and language skills. This year we will read and analyze a variety of texts covering a multitude of genres. Students will progress through the writing process by planning, revising, editing, and publishing specific types of writing. Vocabulary, spelling, and grammar assignments will be covered in each unit content area. Students will work independently and in small groups.

Here are Some Exciting Topics Your Child Will Be Working on in 6th Grade ELA

- Citing text-based evidence to support an analysis of literary text
- Determining a central idea of a text and how it is conveyed through particular details
- Providing a summary of the text distinct from personal opinions or judgments
- Writing arguments to support claims with clear reasons and relevant evidence
- Determining the meaning of literal and figurative language (metaphors and similes) in literary text
- Comparing and contrasting how different genres communicate the same theme or idea

# **Major Course Projects and Instructional Activities**

At least one project will be assigned each grading period. This will be an extension or enrichment of the concepts discussed. Students will have 1 to 3 weeks to complete each project depending on the complexity of the task. Some tasks and/or projects will be completed in class.



#### **Course Assessment Plan**

Students will receive a variety of assignments designed to enhance their learning. If a student is absent, the student is responsible for the missed assignment. Students who have an excused absence will be allowed five days to turn in the missed assignment. Students will have homework assignments each week.

## **Evaluation (Schoolwide Grading Policy)**

Student performance will be recorded and reported in all courses by numerical grades, based on a 100 – point scale.

#### a. Calculation of Final Grades

Final grades will be determined by the cumulative semester average using the following criteria:

• Minor Grades = 60%

Examples include quizzes, labs, and other graded assignments to assess certain standards in a unit of study.

- \*Minimum number of minor grades per 6-week progress report period = 5\*
- *Major Grades* = 40%

Examples include unit tests, essays, research papers, project-based assignments.

\*Minimum number of major grades per 6-week progress report period = 2\*
