6th, 7th & 8th Grade Mrs. Catherine Trujillo Course Syllabus 2022-2023

Course Description and Objectives

The Spanish Exploratory class is designed to develop communication skills in Spanish and to make comparisons and connections to Spanish-speaking cultures with the goal of encouraging understanding and acceptance of differences. Correct pronunciation, reading and writing receive emphasis. Students learn to express and understand receptively ideas on topics such as common conversational phrases, vocabulary using numbers, calendar and weather, descriptions and likes and dislikes. This is a one-semester class which can be taken only once in either 6th, 7th or 8th grade.
