HOW WE LEARN: 90% SPANISH

Learning a second language is much like learning your original native language-you need exposure in order to learn it. Research shows that we learn a language best when we hear it spoken in context with simple, comprehensible, and meaningful messages that are interesting to us. This requires both context and little opportunity to rely on English. You will hear lots of Spanish in class. It will be an adjustment at first, but you can do hard things! You will have resources at all times to help you, such as the word wall, notes, pictures, and visuals, and best of all, your teacher! Learning a language is messy and takes time. Be brave and make mistakes. Most of all, be patient with yourself. Everyone here is starting from scratch too.

CULTURE:

Spanish is a global language spoken officially by over 21 countries and in many regions, especially in the US. Although we study the global nature of Spanish through the history of colonization and the rich culture of the ancient American civilizations, we will also study Latinxs in the US. Throughout the year we will learn culture through the language by interacting with authentic items and native speakers, as well as having various cultural research projects.
