HELLO! I AM *Mrs. Joy Wyche*

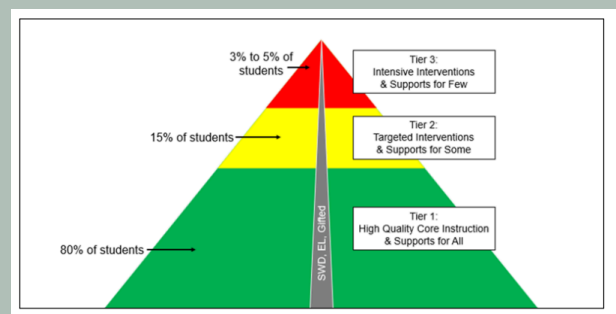

EIP is designed to provide interventions for students who are at risk of not reaching or maintaining their academic grade level based on their performance on state or national assessments or performance measures in English Language Arts/Reading, Mathematics, or both in order to help them meet grade-level expectations within a short time period. I grew up in the Bluegrass State of Kentucky. I hold degrees from Western Kentucky University, University of Phoenix and Nova Southeastern University. This is my 18th year at Freedom Park and have over 20 years of classroom experience ranging from K-12.

INFORMATION

The EIP program provides individualized basic skills instruction as mandated by Georgia Law in the areas of reading, mathematics, and writing. EIP involves targeted, evidence-based interventions, frequent progress monitoring, and clear entrance and exit criteria based on grade level performance. It is not the intent of the program for students to be assigned to EIP/REP on a continuing or permanent basis.
