

In this class, academic dishonesty includes...

- 1. Turning in someone else's work (friend, family, internet, etc.)
- 2. Copying or collaborating inappropriately (e.g., during another class)
- 3. Quoting or closely paraphrasing a source without citation
- 4. Submitting writing created in part or fully by an Al tool (like ChatGPT) without proper acknowledgment
- 5. Using AI to generate essays, written responses, or project components with the intent to present it as original work.

ONE'S OWN IS CONSIDERED PLAGIARISM.

Student agreement for Al use...

- 1. I will use AI tools responsibly (brainstorming, generating ideas) and will not use AI in a way that could harm myself or others.
- 2. I will be honest about when I use AI to help with assignments, and I will not turn in work that is fully created by an AI as my own.
- 1. If I use AI, I will review its work for mistakes.
- 2. I will check with my teacher if unsure about what is acceptable.

HOMEWORK POLICY
