What is it?

Diamond Lakes Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will provide a hard copy to all parents in August during the scheduled open house event. We will also provide copies in the main office. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

Diamond Lakes Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

2024-2025 District Goals

Goal 1:

During the 24-25 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.

Goal 2:

During the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

Goal 3:

During the 24-25 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.

2024-2025 School Goals

Goal 1:

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Diamond Lakes Elementary School will increase students' academic achievement in English Language Arts by increasing rigorous tier 1 literacy instruction, including research-based literacy interventions from 53.1% to 58% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal 2:

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Diamond Lakes Elementary School will increase students' academic achievement in mathematics by engaging students in research-based differentiated instruction to increase the percentage of students scoring at the developing or above achievement level from 38% to 48% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal 3:

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, DLE will increase the number of students scoring proficient or above on the Science GMAS from 20% to 30% by enhancing classroom instruction to focus on inquiry-based learning, integrating technology and differentiating instruction.
