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What is Title I?

Davidson Fine Arts is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement.



What is it?

This is a plan that describe how Davidson Fine Arts will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Davidson Fine Arts values the contributions and involvement of parent & family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

DFA invited all parents to attend our annual School forum last spring to review & revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input & comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year throughout the year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in the plan. DFA will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities and of migratory children.

2025-2026 District Goals



Student Achievement

- During the 25-26 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 6%.
- During the 25-26 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate by 2%.

Talent Development

- During 25-26, we will increase teacher and support staff retention by 3% through consistent, meaningful employee evaluations.

Safe & Secure Learning Environment

- During the 25-26 school year, we will reduce chronic absenteeism by 3%.
- During the 25-26 school year, we will improve the on-time delivery rate of student transportation services by 5%.

As part of this plan, DFA and our families work together to develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. Compacts are reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, & teachers during the spring of each year. Compacts are distributed in the fall and reviewed during the annual meeting.

DFA School Goals

Goal #1:

By May 2026, implement high-impact, differentiated instructional strategies in all ELA and Math classrooms to increase student performance, with the goal of 100% of students scoring at the Proficient or Distinguished level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) and End-of-Course (EOC) exams.

Goal #2

By May 2026, establish two new community partnerships that provide opportunities for funding, collaboration, and/or student internships to support school programs and enhance real-world learning experiences.



Goal #3

By December 2025, promote student growth and well-being by intentionally pairing each child with a dedicated adult mentor on campus to build supportive, consistent relationships throughout the school year as measured by results on the Spring 2026 Panorama Survey.

Parent and Family Engagement

DFA will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

Provide trainings for staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.

Partner with early childhood programs, middle schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.

Share information for parents to understand the school's curriculum, academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators. Provide parents with individual student assessment results and interpretation of those results.

Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, the school website, REMIND, social media and flyers.

Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.

Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement. These meetings will be offered at various times (morning and evening) and in various formats.

Offer Infinite Campus account set up and assistance with usage for parents and family members to monitor their student's progress.

Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events and post a survey on the school website in order to respond to parents requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
