The Davidson Fine Arts Department is thrilled to have received this prestigious honor and looks forward to producing the stage musical with music by Alan Menken and lyrics by Stephen Schwartz. Created to celebrate 30 years of Disney on Broadway, the School of Excellence program is a new initiative recognizing middle and high schools across the United States for their exceptional student-led involvement in theatre production. The nationwide competition called upon schools to demonstrate creativity, leadership, and student engagement in theatrical disciplines such as stagecraft, direction, performance, choreography, and design. Winning schools receive free licensing and production materials to produce a Disney musical between fall 2024 and December 2025, plus exclusive educational webinars with industry professionals. Of the 118 applicants from the US, Davidson is one of 21 winners selected for the inaugural cohort of the program.

Mermaid opened on Broadway and was the best-selling new musical of that year. Disney Theatrical Group opened two critically acclaimed productions on Broadway in 2012, winning seven Tony Awards between them: Peter and the Starcatcher and Newsies, each of which enjoyed a two-year run and launched North American tours, with Newsies playing a record-breaking Fathom Events in-cinema release. Aladdin, Disney Theatrical Group's 2014 hit, continues its smash Broadway run. It has launched nine productions on four continents and been seen by more than 17 million guests. Disney Theatrical Group's newest hit, the 2018 Tony-nominated Best Musical Frozen has launched eight productions around the world. Other stage ventures include the world-premiere of Hercules in Hamburg, Germany, the Olivier-nominated West End hit Shakespeare in Love, stage productions of Disney's High School Musical, Der Glöckner Von Notre Dame in Berlin and King David in concert on Broadway.
