Activities to Build Partnerships

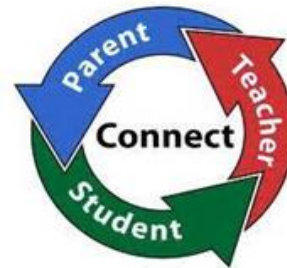

District Goal 2019-2020

Guarantee high academic achievement for all:

By the end of the 2019-2020 school years, the percentage of students performing on grade level in all subject areas will increase by 5 percentage points as measured by district mandated assessments.

School Goals

Goal #1

During the 2019-2020 school year, Glenn Hills Elementary School will increase the number of students scoring developing or above in Math by 10% from 49.3% to 59.3% as measured by the EOG Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal #2

During the 2019-2020 school year, Glenn Hills Elementary School will increase the number of students scoring developing or above in Reading by 10% from 50.2% to 60.2% as measured by the EOG Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal #3

Glenn Hills Elementary will decrease the amount of PBIS Tier 2 students from 7% to 4% in the 2019-2020 school year.
