Grading Scale

Class work 40 - % Assessment test -30% Performance task -20% Homework -10%

Homework is ONE grade that will be composed of however many assignments are given in a particular grading period. For example, if I collect/check 10 homework assignments during the 1st 9 weeks, and the student turns in 8, then his/her Homework grade for the 9 weeks is an 80. <u>I do not give homework every night</u>. It is the student's responsibility to complete what is assigned to him/her they are welcome to take home any assignment to complete it for that night; practice is essential to mastery of the standard.
