### GRADING AND GRADUATION



An official class rank is compiled for each grade that is computed at the end of the year. Averages are carried out to three decimal places and final averages are not rounded. Student’s grade point average (GPA) is based on quality points. Regular high school courses are on a 4.0 scale and Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment College/University courses are on a 5.0 scale. High school student transcripts include the GPA, class rank, and numerical average. To obtain an ARJ Diploma Seal, students must take an additional science and math course beyond the Georgia Graduation Requirements and complete a CTAE pathway.
