Hephzibah High School is the third largest high school by enrollment in the Richmond County School System (RCSS). When chartered by the Georgia Assembly in 1870, Brothersville became known as the city of Hephzibah. The school enjoys an even longer history – in 1860 it was chartered by local residents and is the second oldest high school in Richmond County. In 2016, Hephzibah High School began the transition to the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) and completed the certification in 2019-2020.

An official class rank is compiled for each grade that is computed at the end of the year. Averages are carried out to three decimal places and final averages are not rounded. Student's grade point average (GPA) is based on quality points. Regular high school courses are on a 4.0 scale and Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and College/University courses are on a 5.0 scale awarded for each grade earned. High school student transcripts include the GPA, class rank, and numerical average.

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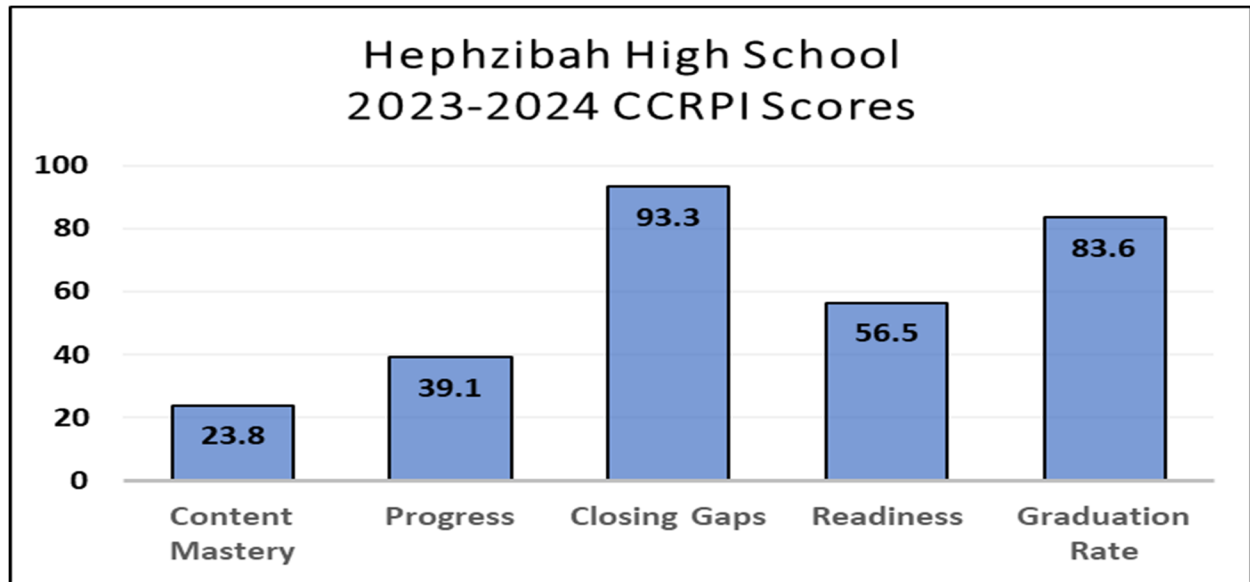
