

Locklan McBean, who was awarded a town lot in Augusta and 500 acres of "choice land" outside Augusta. Our community is named after Locklan McBean who came here from Scotland in 1796. Land was cleared on Hephzibah-McBean Road and our school was built at a cost of \$5.9 million. McBean Elementary replaced Floyd Graham Elementary School. Furniture, equipment, and materials were moved over the Christmas holidays. The staff and 326 students relocated to the new McBean Elementary School on January 12, 1998.

Our CCRPI stats:

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in five main categories, for a total of 100 possible points. In 2019-2020, statewide accountability was suspended due to COVID-19 closures.
