The mission of Warren Road Elementary School is to lay the foundation for our students' lifelong learning by providing opportunities for them to grow academically, physically, artistically, socially, and emotionally in a nurturing, yet challenging environment.

Our Story:

Established in 1970, Warren Road is a public school with an Arts Infusion program within the Richmond County School System. Historically, Warren Road was a neighborhood school serving students from nearby neighborhoods. In efforts to increase enrollment and participation in the arts, in 2009, Warren Road piloted an arts program. Currently, Warren Road serves over 650 students in grades PreK-5, 10% of which are Arts Infusion students. Admittance into the Arts Infusion Program is based on prior academic criteria, good character/behavior, and district preference. Many students attending Warren Road go on to further their education in Richmond County Magnet Schools. Warren Road is located in Augusta which is the second largest and oldest city in Georgia. Augusta is best known as the Garden City and home of the Masters Golf Tournament.



College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers, and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures student achievement on indicators such as content mastery, student growth on progress, subgroup performance on closing gaps, and various areas including Lexile performance, attendance, and other academic based measurements. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Each individual component score is on a scale of 0-100.
