

#### **Student Achievement and Success**

- During the 25-26 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 6%.
- During the 25-26 school year, we will increase posthigh school readiness by increasing our graduation rate by 2%.

#### School Goals/Focus Areas

#### **ELA/Reading**

- By June 2026, grades 3-5 will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or above on the ELA EOG assessment from 10.82% to 25% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- By June 2026, grades 3-5 will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or above on the Math EOG assessment from 6.57% to 20% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Focus Areas: Practice phonics, sight word fluency, and vocabulary daily. Read to students to build reading fluency, discuss story elements, and build reading comprehension skills.

#### **MATH**

- By May 2026, grades K-2 will increase the percentage of students scoring on or above grade level on the i-Ready Reading assessment from 48% to 65% as measured by the EOY i-Ready Reading diagnostic Assessment.
- By May 2026, grades K-2 will increase the percentage of students scoring on or above grade level on the i-Ready Math assessment from 36% to 55% as measured by the EOY i-Ready Math diagnostic Assessment.

Focus Areas: Practice number sense, fact fluency and problem solving daily.

# At school

#### **Barton Chapel Student Commitment**

Barton Chapel Elementary students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and aim to go the distance in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas about how they can make the connections between learning at home and school:

- Students will practice basic math facts. Students will also use mental math strategies from Number
- Students will read for at least 20 minutes each night.
- Students will give newsletters and other communications about school events and classroom instruction to my parents.
