
DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP

SAFETY, PRIVACY, AND SECURITY

When students go online, whether they're playing multiplayer games, using social media apps, or posting their latest creative expressions, it's important that they understand how to keep their private information safe.

- Use privacy settings- Sit down with your student to show the privacy settings on your apps and devices. Talk about why you keep certain information private or limited to a small group.
- 2. Read the fine print- Find the privacy policy of your favorite app and read it together. Can you tell what information the company collects and what they do with it? Are they selling it? Storing it? Keeping it safe?
- 3. Discuss online scams, clickbait, and "special offers" - Share experiences of being targeted for a scam. Ever received a fishy email or text? Discuss the telltale signs of a hoax, including poor grammar, misspellings, Photoshopped images, and close-but-not-exact company logos.
