Prerequisite(s): American Government

Course Description:

World History is a survey of people of both western and non-western civilizations. The high school World History course provides students with a comprehensive, intensive study of major events and themes in world history. Students will begin with a study of the earliest civilizations worldwide and continue to examine major developments and themes in all regions of the world. Concepts and skills in problem solving and critical thinking are developed in accordance with the Georgia Performance Standards of Excellence.

- **Unexcused Absence:** Students, who miss assignments or tests due to an unexcused absence may in the sound discretion of the principal or designee, be given the opportunity to make up work.

Grading Policies

To assist in this matter major test will be announced at least one week in advance. If a student misses an assignments or tests, he or she will have five days to make up the work.
