



Friday, November 21st, the players went to Rockmart to play in the second round of state playoffs. Our team fell short; however, we commend our team for an excellent season.

We spoke to several of the players and they shared that they "stayed true to their game plan." They also mentioned that they were confident this would not be their final game of the season. Laney Wildcats Take Center Stage in November's Spotlight!





Saturday (Nov. 13th), 8 members (4 teams) of the Laney Debate team competed in the November AUDL Competition. They represented Laney well with our largest group ever going to competition. We had one team (2 students) medal in the Junior Varsity Division; Vertez Moore and Napoleon Phillips. Congratulations to both of them, but also to our entire group of competitors who traveled and debated very well in this competition. Our next traveling debate is in February and again in March for the final tournament of the 2025-2026 season. We will be working toward hosting a debate here in Augusta in January.

Recent History of Debate in RCSS:

Debate was brought to the High Schools in Richmond County in 2023. Laney Debate Team joined the other RCSS High Schools at that time. We are in our 3rd year and working to bring Debate Tournaments to Augusta Schools locally. We are hoping to officially host our first competition in January 2026. Currently, the Debate Team travels 4 times a year to Atlanta in order to compete with the Atlanta Urban Debate League. We compete on 4 different levels determined by years of experience. Novice students are in their 1st year of debate, possibly 2nd if they have not competed much in their prior year. Junior Varsity is 2 to 3 years, Varsity is 3 to 4 years, and the Open Division is 3 or more years.

Laney Debate Team competes in what is called Policy Debate. Our topic is something currently in the government and they debate the same topic all year long. The evidence they use in the debate is provided by Emory University to the lower divisions and the Open division does all of their own research for their debates. This year's topic is about OTEC (Ocean Thermal Energy Conservation) systems and if the US Government should support the building and running of these with Financial and Technology assistance. In policy debate, climate change and democracy are the 2 main points that have to be covered in every debate topic. Students debate from both the Affirmative and the Negative point of view. In one debate competition, they will have 4 rounds to compete in, each lasting approximately an hour. They will debate the affirmative side 2 times and the negative 2 times totaling 4 rounds total. Students are scored as a team of 2... which team convinced the judge that their side had the better argument, and they are scored individually on their speaking ability. A top percentage of students receive medals awarded at the end of the competition based on how many entries and teams were in each competition.

One of the best parts of debate is that students get to learn how to argue and to defend their point of view in a structured method. There are always 2 sides to every story, and debate teaches students to see from multiple points of view, not just their own. It teaches about citing your evidence and backing up your claims. It also teaches about public speaking and how to represent yourself. Students have the opportunity to earn a cord for graduation through their competition experience.



Regional Champs




Lucy C. Laney Cheerleaders are in the spotlight! WFXG shows off the Wildcats cheerleading hard work, passion, and pride.
