In kindergarten, many topics are covered as we help your child learn, develop, and grow while setting the foundation for the remaining school years. Below, you will see a brief overview of the concepts covered during kindergarten for each subject.

## Language Arts

letter recognition, initial sounds, middle and ending sounds, count, produce, blend and segment phoneme in spoken words, onset and rhyme, blending words, read common high frequency words by sight, recognize and produce rhyming words, reading grade level texts, listening to a story and providing information about the story such as sequence of events, setting, character information, identifying main character, name author and illustrator and define their roles, concepts of print, narrate a writing using capitalization and punctuation correctly, continue a conversation through multiple exchanges, describe familiar people, places, things, and events in detail, spell simple words phonetically

## Math

identify numerals 0-100, count to 100 by 10's and 1's, one to one correspondence, concepts of teen numbers with place value, comparing numbers, count forward from a given number, write numbers to represent a group of objects, connect counting to cardinality, classify objects into categories, measuring using non-standard units, measuring and analyzing data, using and creating graphs, identifying and working with 2-d and 3-d shapes, exploring addition and subtraction, working with word problems

## Science

describe sky as it changes from day to night, classify objects according to day or night sky, sun applies heat to the earth, group rocks by physical attributes, observe soil features, recognize earth materials, push, pull, and roll objects and describe their motion, gravity, living and non-living, organism comparison

## **Social Studies**

Identify purpose of national holidays and how they are observed, identify important American symbols and explain their meaning, changes over time, describe American culture by explaining diverse community and family celebrations and customs, maps and globe features, where you live, how rules are made and why they should be followed, character traits, jobs with needs and wants, income for work, goods and service
