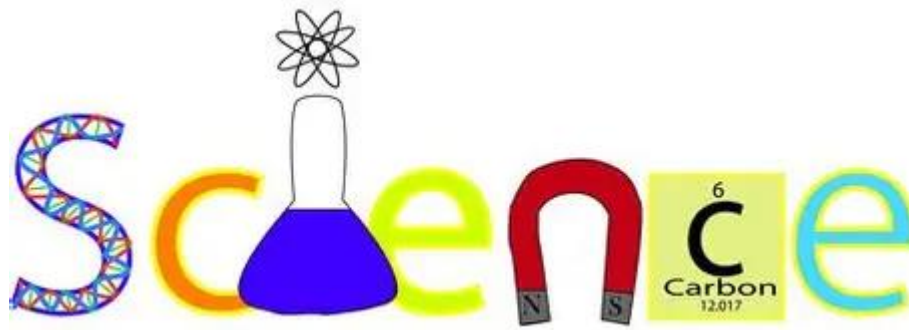

2025-2026 Imagine Edgenuity Lab Guidelines & Expectations

1. Come to class prepared and bring your own paper, pen/pencils, highlighters, 3-ring binder and WIRED headphones/earbuds everyday.
2. **All** Pretests, Lab Assessments, Quizzes, Topic Tests and Cumulative Exams **must be completed in class with Ms. Worthy**. Violation of this rule will result in the assessment being reset and completing the lesson in its entirety. You will be required to start from the beginning of your assessment once you complete the lesson. A zero (0) will be given if this is a repeated violation.
3. **No assistance will be provided during Pretests (Only CR courses have PT)**. The pretest is designed to see if you retained information you were previously covered.
4. If you take a pretest and score an 80 or better, you will BYPASS that lesson. The lesson will be bypassed but you can still be access the lesson if needed. **Vocabulary and Summary** for the lesson bypassed will be required.
Note: BYPASSED indicates that you have successfully mastered the content in the pretest and you can move to the next lesson's pretest, however you will still be tested on this information for the Unit/Topic Test and Cumulative Exam. (You will still be able to gain access to the lesson if you want to go through them anyway).
5. You are required to conference with Ms. Worthy if you do not master your pretest or quiz attempt #1. This is the time you ask questions about information that is unclear or confusing to you, not when you are out of retakes or during your assessment.
6. All lessons must be completed in sequence.
7. Imagine Edgenuity is not a group activity: Do not share answers or notes with your classmates. Violating this expectation will result in a permanent zero (0).
8. Note taking is required whether in or outside of class.
 - Guided notes should be neatly organized in your science designated 3-ring binder.
 - Your science designated 3-ring binder will be collected at the end of each period and stored in the classroom.
 - Notes should consist of materials from your vocabulary, direct instruction, practice/assignment, and classroom assignments. **Each note page** should contain your first and last name, date, course name and class period for easy reference.
 - The entire course must be completed with a passing grade (see grading section on syllabus) **AND ALL** notes must be turned in to Ms. Worthy before you take your cumulative exam. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
9. You are to remain on the Imagine Edgenuity site at all times. Do not "Google" assessment questions for answers on Google, Wikipedia, cell phone or other resources, etc. Violation of this policy will result in the assessment being reset. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
10. Do not bring food or drinks into the classroom. Do not bring software, entertainment or any other type of technology into the classroom unless directed by your facilitator. **OTHERWISE NO EXCEPTIONS.**
11. No sleeping or cell phones in class under any circumstances.
12. Check your Imagine Edgenuity progress daily by looking at your assignment calendar. Your **actual grade** is determined by your progress in your class. You are to make at least 3% progress every day.
13. You can access Imagine Edgenuity outside of school and encouraged to work on lessons (any assignment not mentioned in #2) at home.

Keep this document to access it as a quick reference so you know what is expected from you.

Introduction

Imagine Edgenuity is a computer-based, online learning system that provides students with another medium for achieving academic credit. Imagine Edgenuity allows students to work using a computer-generated calendar to guide students in completing necessary academic courses without sacrificing the rigor of a traditional classroom.

Student Objectives

- ❖ Students will work individually through their assigned course using the Imagine Edgenuity program unless assigned as a group assignment.
- ❖ Students will take notes proficiently to aid their learning of the content.
- ❖ Students will demonstrate their mastery of the concepts of their assigned classes by completing quizzes, unit tests, labs, cumulative exam(s) and other assignments given by the teacher if uploaded in Canvas or another platform.

Student Expectations

- ❖ Lab Reports will be submitted electronically and graded by Ms. Worthy.
- ❖ Students will complete their class on an individual basis working **at a pace** to complete by the designated target date.
- ❖ Students will take notes (for each lesson) that will be turned in to Ms. Worthy before taking the cumulative exam.
- ❖ To obtain mastery, students must score a minimum of **70%** on all quizzes, a minimum of **76%** on unit/topic tests and a minimum of **76%** cumulative exam.
- ❖ Students will receive **2** attempts to pass their quiz which include 1 pre-test and 1 quiz attempt. Students will receive **2** attempts to pass their Unit/Topic Test. Students will receive **2** attempts to pass their Cumulative Exam. (These are subject to change to reflect the RCSS Online Learning Manual)

Science Courses: Biology (Milestone Required), Chemistry, Earth Systems, Environmental Science, Physical Science and Physics. Required to pass **4 Sciences** for graduation

Grading: Students will receive credit for the course once they have turned in all course notes and achieved a grade of a 70 or higher as their final grade in Imagine Edgenuity. If the course has a milestone, the Imagine Edgenuity final grade must be a 76 or higher before taking the Milestone. You will be given a chance to re-do assignments and reviews before taking a quiz, unit/topic test or exam if the grade is not satisfactory.

Milestone: Biology is currently the only Science Course that requires a Milestone that currently counts 10% of the Imagine Edgenuity Final Grade. (Subject to change)

Notes

Guided notes will be used. Effective note-taking is an important practice for successful completion of a course on Imagine Edgenuity. Note-taking allows you to process and understand the information you receive. Also, it helps you to understand and remember material and make



connections.

If notes are lost or stolen, students must replace them at their own expense. Students are allowed to use your notes on quizzes and tests but **NOT** on Cumulative exams.



Class Rules

We are part of the Richmond County School System. Therefore, all rules will be followed (i.e. dress code, electronic devices, plagiarism, etc.) In addition, keep these rules in mind:



- ❖ Be on time and ready to work when the tardy bell rings.
- ❖ Respect others and their property. Only positive comments are allowed.
- ❖ Remain on task. Sleeping is not allowed in class.
- ❖ No excessive eating or drinking will be allowed into the classroom/lab.
- ❖ Software, entertainment or any other type of technology will not be allowed into the classroom/lab unless directed by your facilitator. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- ❖ MUSIC during instruction time IS NOT ALLOWED. This applies to school issued device as well as personal devices.
- ❖ You must ask the teacher and given permission before leaving the classroom.
- ❖ YOU ARE NOT ALLOWED TO VISIT OTHER WEBSITES unless instructed by the teacher.
- ❖ Obey all school rules. This covers all rules in the STUDENT HANDBOOK not specifically covered above.



Cell Phones/Electronic Devices

The school policy is very clear that students should not have cell phones or other electronic devices during classroom instruction. Students are not allowed to connect any electronic device to computers or outlets. Students will be given a verbal warning to put it away. If within the same class period, a student uses their phone, the incident will be documented in Infinite Campus, parent contact, and an administrator or designee will be contacted immediately. If a student refuses to follow the guidelines outlined by the teacher, an administrator or designee will be contacted immediately.



Tips on How to Be Successful In This Course

1. Always take good notes and keep them organized in your 3-ring binder. Listen carefully to the lectures using your wired headphones/earbuds.
2. Using the **closed captioning** text is strongly encouraged along when using your **guided notes**. This will assist those who may be struggling. Guided notes are not currently available for Environmental Science. The guided notes must be completed by you, the student in your own handwriting.
3. Make sure you understand the content before taking an assessment. Ask the teacher for help before beginning your assessment.
4. Monitor your target date! Don't let yourself get behind in your work and risk not completing your class on time.
5. Follow the outlined course completion calendar on your assignment course page to help you stay on target or get ahead.
