Increasing Literacy Skills

At BHS we will use programs which include specifically-based researched strategies to support supplemental academic intervention which includes:

- 1. The Lexile Framework for Reading in Action
- 2. "Struggling Reader Strategies" from Content Reading Strategies That Work

Each of the programs above will provide teachers with tools to assist in differentiating instruction in order to reach all learners. The strategies include descriptions, examples, and templates of various strategies including graphic organizers that have been developed and used for many years. These are reading strategies that can be used before, during, and/or after reading. Once the students learn and practice these strategies, they will be able to apply them to connect and interact with any text they are required to read.

Some Researched Strategies will include:

- 1. Literature Circles
- 2. Guided Reading Assignments
- 3. Collaborative Annotation
- 4. Cornell Notes
- 5. Modeling


