

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What is Title I?

What is it?

2024-2025 District Goals

- During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.
- During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase posthigh school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.
- During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

nitiative 2: By the end of the 2024-2025 school rear, Richmond Hill Elementary School will increase he content mastery in Math by an overall 25% from peginning to proficient as measured by Georgia Milestones Assessment in grades 3-5 and an overall 25% from two grade levels below to on grade as neasured by i-ready in grades K-5.

nitiative 3: By the end of the 2024-2025 school rear, Richmond Hill Elementary School will continue o build a supportive learning environment that ntegrates social, emotional, and academic support and instruction to increase student attendance by 25% from 70% to 95% and decrease the number of behavior incidences of disorderly conduct by 25% rom 190 to 142 as measured by ABC Data reports in JSHA.

Richmond Hill Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Communicate with parents on a weekly basis and respond to parental concerns within 48 hours of contact.
- Keep parents informed about their child's academic progress and changes in behavior.
- Send home daily or weekly homework assignments.
- Develop reading and math goals based on student data and assist students in reaching them.
- Provide monthly training for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement.
- Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- Work with our parents to develop relevant training and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parental involvement.
- Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parental involvement policy.
- Collect feedback from parents at all events, place input cards around the building, and post suggestion forms on the school website to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parental involvement activities.
