K-When counting, says the numbers names in the standard order, pairing with one number name.

1st Grade - Recall 10 basic math facts in 1 minute with at least 80% accuracy.

2nd grade - Number facts through 20, adding and subtracting with regrouping, problem solving and algebraic thinking.
