- Provide parents with a home learning kit full of material dealing with geometrical shapes, compare and contrast of literary text.
- Provide a link on the school website to Edmodo which would give parents an opportunity to access and review strategies which can assist with assignments at home.

At Home

- Try to attend Family Literacy Nights, Math/ Science Nights, Parent Workshops, PTA meetings, and Parent/Teacher conferences.
