Our Goals for Student Achievement

RCSS District Goals

Goal #1 During the 24-25 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%

Goal #2 During the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

Goal #3 During the 24-25 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.

Pine Hill Middle School Goals

By the end of May 2025, PHMS will implement interventions and differentiated instruction to increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Reading Assessment from 23.12% (129 students) to 43.81% (241 students). Additionally, 75% or more of our students will show at least typical growth on the reading i-Ready diagnostic.

By the end of May 2025, PHMS will implement interventions and differentiated instruction to increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment from 2.73% (15 students) to 38.2% (213 students). Additionally, 75% or more of our students will show typical growth on the math i-Ready diagnostic.

By May 2025 our attendance rate will increase from 72.8% to 89.7%
