In the School

Pine Hill Middle School will work with students and their families to support students' success in mastering the standards in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Play board games and computer games with new vocabulary words and find ways to use these words in family conversations.
- Have fun with math and involve students. Have students calculate the tip at a restaurant or the actual price of something on sale.
- Discuss proper online etiquette, as well as how to be safe online.

Pine Hill Middle School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Try to make up my own learning game and share it with parents and teacher during Curriculum Nights.
- Bring a class newsletter home about Family Fun academic activities and encourage parents and family to participate.
- Create games using models, such as: Legos and straws to model math problems; and note cards to write down newly learned vocabulary words.
- Take home materials from the learning kit for parent to view and assist student with.
