What is Title I?

Warren Road Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support

family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievemen

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Warren Road Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Warren Road Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common go of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Warren Road Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Warren Road Elementary School annually invites all parents to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website @rcboe.org/warren for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. If the plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school will submit any comments to the district office.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Warren Road Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Richmond County Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the student code of conduct book that is given to all students. Warren Road's Parent and Family Engagement Plan will also be posted on the school website @rcboe.org/warren and distributed at the Title I Annual Meeting. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2025-2026 District Goals

During the 2025-2026 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

During the 2025-2026 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 71% to 75%.

During the 2025-2026 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

2025-2026 School Goals

By the end of 2025-2026 school year, the number of students scoring on or above grade level will increase by at least 10 % on iReady reading (K-2) and GMAS ELA (3-5) by using the RCSS Cross-Curricular Reading Expectations and non-negotiables.

By the end of 2025-2026 school year, the number of students scoring on or above grade level will increase by at least 10 % on iReady MATH (K-2) and GMAS MATH (3-5) by using the new math standards and RCSS Math Curriculum Expectations and non-negotiables.

By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, discipline referrals will decrease by at least 3% to ensure a more positive climate and academically challenging environment with the long-term goal of increasing from 4 stars to 5 stars on the CCRPI.

*I-Ready is an online program used in our county to support student learning in reading and mathematics. It begins with a diagnostic test that identifies each student's strength and areas of growth. The results help teachers understand where students are academically and guide instruction. Based on the diagnostic results, I-Ready provides individualized lessons tailored to each student's skill level. These lessons are interactive and adaptive, helping students progress at their own pace.



School-Parent Compact

As part of our commitment to family engagement, Warren Road Elementary will work collaboratively with parents, students, and teachers to develop a School-Parent Compact—an agreement that outlines how all parties will work together to help students improve, meet or exceed the challenging state academic standards. This compact will be reviewed and updated annually to reflect the changing needs of our families and school environment, with input welcomed from parents, students, teachers, and other stakeholders. The compact will be shared during Open House, the Title I Annual Meeting, parent-teacher conferences, online, and will be available in the Parent Resource Center upon request. We are dedicated to building strong partnerships to support student success, and parents are encouraged to request meetings at any time through the teacher, principal, and, if necessary, the Richmond County Board of Education.

Communication

Warren Road Elementary will host several events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Most meetings for parents and family members will be held in the morning before school, during the day by appointment and in the evening for special events. Transportation and childcare services may be provided for certain meetings and activities, depending on availability.

Reservation of Funds

The Richmond County School System receives more than \$500,000 in Title I, Part A funding and allocates a portion of the required 1% reservation for parent and family engagement to Warren Road Elementary, the school will actively involve parents and family members in decisions about how those funds are used. Parents will be invited to participate in planning meetings, surveys, and feedback sessions where they can share their ideas and priorities for engagement activities. The school will also seek input during events such as the Title I Annual Meeting and through the School Council or Parent Advisory Committee. All feedback will be considered in collaboration with school leadership to ensure that the funds are used effectively to support meaningful and inclusive family engagement efforts that reflect the needs and interests of the school community.


