






Our Goals for Student Achievement

Richmond County District Goals

- 1.During the 24-25 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.
- 2.During the 24-25 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.
- 3.During the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

Deer Chase Elementary School Goals

- 1.By the end of the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of students on grade level on EOY iReady Reading Diagnostic from 44% to 64% (239 to 339 students) by implementing additional research-based vocabulary & comprehension strategies.
- 2.By the end of the 24-25 school year, we will increase the number of students on grade level on EOY iReady Math Diagnostic from 33% to 53% (181 to 281 students) by implementing additional research-based strategies in numbers and operations and algebra and algebraic thinking.
- 3.By the end of the 24-25 school year, we will increase from 39% to 52% in the area of emotional regulation per the Panorama student survey.
