# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## Richmond County District Goals

During the 25-26 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 6%.

- During the 25-26 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate by 2%.

- During 25-26, we will increase teacher and support staff retention by 3% through consistent, meaningful employee evaluations.

- During the 25-26 school year, we will improve the on-time delivery rate of student transportation services by 5%

## Deer Chase Elementary School Goals

1. By May 2026, we will increase the number of students on grade level from 48% to 73% (236 to 366) as measured by the EOY Reading i-Ready Diagnostic.

2. By May 2026, we will increase the number of students on grade level from 30% to 60% (174 to 300) as measured by the EOY Math i-Ready Diagnostic.

3. By May 2026, we will increase from 62% to 72% in perseverance as measured by the EOY Panorama student survey.
