School: What Teachers Will Do at School

Diamond Lakes Elementary School will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be: Math: We will provide students with Number Talks lessons daily in math instruction. As well as daily fluency stations will be utilized in all classrooms. We will teach daily with manipulatives and provide for student use in stations. We will also be utilizing resources from Inspire, especially the learning plans.

Reading: Teachers will provide information about I-Ready, using Lexile scores, Sadlier Phonics to Reading, Sadlier Vocabulary, Sadlier Grammar, Sadlier Progress while using My View Literacy as our curriculum resource. We will also be utilizing resources from Inspire to help accelerate and remediate students.



What Families Will Do at Home

Diamond Lakes Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

Math: I will have my child practice grade level math strategies using Number Talks lessons and use Mental Math strategies from Number Talks every day.

Reading: I will log my child onto MyOn and I-Ready reading daily and have them read from their recommended Lexile range (spans from 100L below to 50L above).

Students: What Students Will Do
