Welcome Parents, School Staff, and Community Members

Diamond Lakes Elementary receives money from Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act. This law provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to school systems based on high numbers or percentages of children who meet certain financial criteria. These funds are provided to help ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to succeed in school by meeting the challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards."

Purpose of Meeting

"The federal law requires that each school system receiving "Title I, Part A funds" jointly develop with parents and stakeholders of all participating children. Assistance is requested in planning our family engagement activities and specifically in revising district and school policies, School Improvement Plan, School-Parent Compact, Building Staff Capacity (determining what training our staff needs to promote good school-family partnerships, and determining how best to spend our family engagement funds).

Topics are covered in a way to provided an opportunity to ask questions, offer suggestions, and participate in more detailed discussions.

Title I-receiving schools in the district must also distribute parent and family engagement policies agreed to by the parents.




LEA PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY

- School Districts: The district parent and family engagement policy must describe how the district will:
 - Involve parents in the joint <u>development</u> of the district plan;
 - Provide the support necessary to assist schools in implementing <u>effective family engagement</u> activities;
 - Conduct an annual evaluation of the effectiveness of the policy in improving the academic quality of Title I schools, including identifying barriers to greater participation by families, (especially family members who are economically disadvantaged, disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are a racial or ethnic minority) and use the findings to design strategies to support successful school and family interactions and revise engagement policies; and
 - Involve families in <u>schools activities</u>, which may include establishing an advisory board to develop, revise and review the engagement policy.



SCHOOL PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY

Title I Schools:

The school parents and family engagement policy must describe how the school will:


- Convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time to which all parents of low-income students are invited and encouraged to attend, to <u>inform parents</u> that their school receives Title I funds, that these funds come with requirements, and that parents have a right to be involved;
- Offer a flexible number of engagement <u>meetings</u> at convenient times for families (for which the school may provide transportation, child care, or home visits using Title I funds);
- Provide parents and families with:
 - Information about Title I-funded programs;
 - An explanation of the curriculum and achievement levels the school uses; and
 - If requested, opportunities for regular meetings to participate in decisions relating to the education of their student.

SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT


- Jointly develop with parents and stakeholders- a <u>school-parent compact</u> that outlines how families, school, staff and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and develop a partnership to help students achieve state standards.
 - The compact must:
 - Describe the school's responsibility to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables students to meet the academic achievement standards, and the ways in which each parent will be responsible for supporting learning, including volunteering in their child's classroom, and participating in decisions relating to the education of their children;
 - Address the importance of <u>communication between families and staff</u> through, at a minimum:
 - <u>parent-teacher conferences</u> in elementary schools, at least annually, during which the compact will be discussed as the compact relates to the individual child's achievement;
 - frequent reports to parents on their children's progress; and
 - opportunities to volunteer in or observe their child's class
 - <u>Ensure regular two-way meaningful communication</u> between family members and school staff in a language they understand.

TITLE I FUNDS

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Set Aside:

Each district receiving more than \$500,000 in Title I Part A Funds is required to reserve at least one percent of its Title I funds to carry out parent and family engagement activities, including those described in the written policy section below. Ninety (90) percent of these "set-aside" funds must be distributed to schools, with priority given to "high-need" schools. The law further requires that parents and family members of students must be included in decisions regarding how these engagement funds are spent.

School Improvement Plan

Diamond Lakes Elementary Annually evaluates the schoolwide plan using data from the State's assessments, other student performance data, and perception data to determine if the schoolwide program has been effective in addressing the major problem areas and in turn, increasing student achievement, particularly for the lowestachieving students. Schools must annually revise the plan, as necessary, based on student needs and the results of the evaluation to ensure continuous improvement. (ESEA section 1114(b)(3); 34 C.F.R. § 200.26(c)).



School Improvement Plan Input

School Goals

Goal 1: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Diamond Lakes Elementary School will increase students' academic achievement in English Language Arts by increasing rigorous tier 1 literacy instruction, including research-based literacy interventions from 53.1% to 58% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal 2: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Diamond Lakes Elementary School will increase students' academic achievement in mathematics by engaging students in research-based differentiated instruction to increase the percentage of students scoring at the developing or above achievement level from 38% to 48% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal 3: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, DLE By May 2025, Diamond Lakes Elementary will decrease the number of students with 10 or more absences from 45.5% to 40%.


