District Goals

Richmond County School System sets goals for the entire district.

District Goals are:

By the end of the 2019-2020 school year, the percentage of students performing on grade level in all subject areas will increase by 5% points as measured by district mandated assessments.

School Goals

- For FY20, GHHS will implement data driven best practices and rigorous instructional strategies aimed at a 15% increase in the number of 9th grade students who score proficient on the EOY I-Ready (ELA/Math) as compared to the BOY I-Ready.
- Over the course of the 2019 2020 school year all GHHS teachers will engage in weekly collaborative planning sessions that address research-based best practices to include student engagement, student performance, rigor, and differentiation at the operational level as defined by the GADOE Impact Rubric.
- For the FY20, GHHS will decrease the number of behavior infractions from FY 19 by 15% through the implementation of Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) initiative.

Improving Vocabulary

As a school – We will distribute a list of content vocabulary for parents and students to master at home in addition to teacher recommended educational Web sites for extra practice in developing vocabulary, and provide parents with a progress log to monitor students' practice on the vocabulary Websites.

As a parent – I will ensure that my child masters the list of content area vocabulary words by the end of each nine weeks grading period, and ensure my child spends 45 minutes every week practicing on the recommended vocabulary websites by reviewing the student usage record and signing off on the weekly progress log provided by the school.

As a student – I will work with my parent to master the list of content area vocabulary words by the end of each nine weeks grading period, and complete 45 minutes each week of vocabulary practice on the recommended websites and include my signed progress log in the appropriate subject matter notebook for conferences.
