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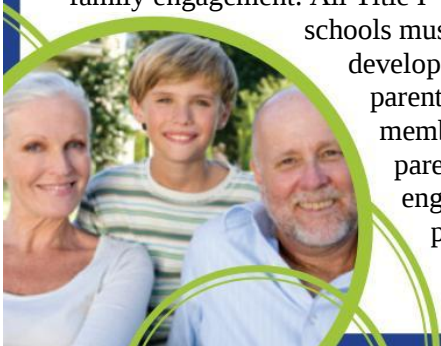

What is Title I?

W.S. Hornsby Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I

schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how W.S. Hornsby Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. W.S. Hornsby Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that W.S. Hornsby Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

W.S. Hornsby Elementary invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum this fall to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. W.S. Hornsby Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Richmond County Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. The W.S. Hornsby Elementary School Parent and Family Engagement Plan will also be posted on the school website and at the Title 1 Annual Meeting. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2025-2026 District Goals

*During the 25-26 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 6%.

*During the 25-26 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate by 2%.

2025-2026 School Goals/Initiatives

*By the end of 2026, increase the number of students scoring Proficient by 10% on GMAS (3-5) and i-Ready (K-5) in reading and math.

*Effectively implement intervention to decrease the percentage of K-5 students scoring two or more grade levels below by 20% in reading and math.

*By the end of 2026, reduce students and staff with 5+ absences by 15%.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, W.S. Hornsby Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, teachers, and all other stakeholders. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during Open House, the Title 1 Annual Meeting, online, during parent-teacher conferences and in the Parent Resource Room.

Hornsby Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Due to current circumstances, meetings will take place as safety precautions will allow.

Open House/Parent Portal Training - August 4, 2025

We invite all parents to the Open House to meet the teachers and tour the school as we begin an exciting new year together.

Annual Title I Meeting/Building Parent Capacity #1 – August 19, 2025

We invite you to join us to learn about our Title I program, what it is, how it supports our students, and how families can get involved. We will share details about our parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, the school parent compact, and parents' roles in supporting student success. Invitations will be posted on the school website and calendar, and a Shout Point message will be sent.

National STEM Day/ Title I Parent Night/Building Parent Capacity #2–November 7, 2025. Celebrate National STEM Day with us! Families will engage in hands-on science, technology, engineering, and math activities, receive valuable updates on student progress, and learn how to support academic growth at home. Black History Celebration/Literacy Night/Building Parent Capacity #3 – February 27, 2025, at 5:00 pm-7:00 pm

Celebrate the legacy of Black history while building strong literacy skills! Families will engage with culturally rich texts written by and about influential African Americans. Empower your child's voice through the power of words and history!

GMAS/Math Night/Building Parent Capacity #4 – March 10, 2025, from 5:00-6:00 pm

Families will participate in roundtable discussions with the principal and school staff to review the schoolwide plan, parent and family engagement policy, school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Learn effective strategies to support your child in math and get valuable tips to help them feel confident and prepared for the GMAS assessment.

W.S. Hornsby Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in an understandable format and language and posted on the school website.

Provide trainings for staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.

Share information for parents to understand the school's curriculum, academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators. Provide parents with individual student assessment results and interpretation of those results.

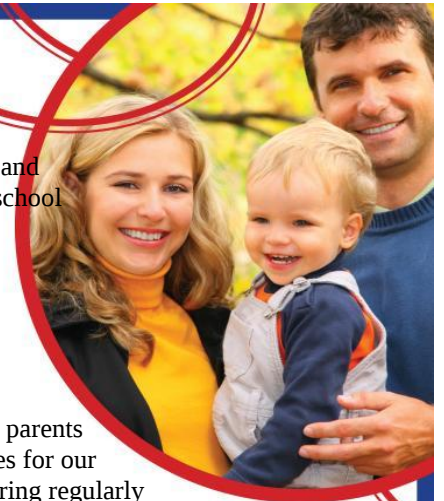
Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through the school website, phone messages, and flyers.

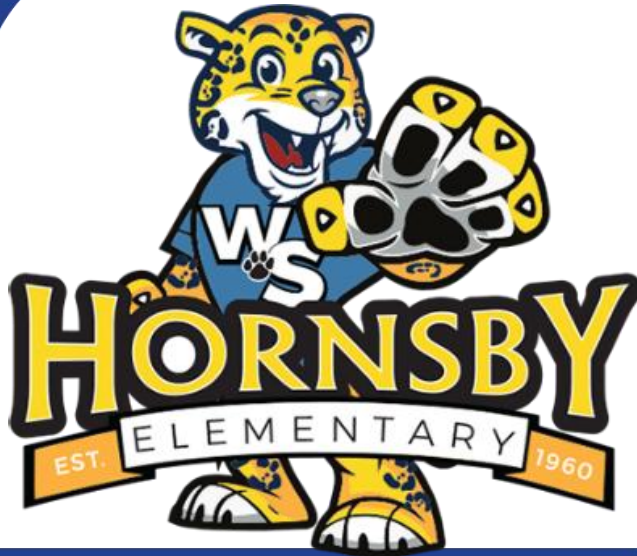
Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
