During the 2024-25 school year we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.

During the 2024-25 school year we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.

During the 2024-25 school year we will increase the number of highly effective teachers retained in Richmond County by 3%

2024-25 School Goals

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, third through fifth grade students scoring developing or higher on the ELA end of the grade assessment will increase from 27 % to 32%.

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, kindergarten through fifth grade students scoring two or more grade levels below will decrease from 32% to 27% in reading as measured by and iReady math diagnostic.


