

Welcome Parents, School Staff, and Community Members

Lamar-Milledge Elementary receives money from Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act. This law provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to school systems based on high numbers or percentages of children who meet certain financial criteria. These funds are provided to help ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to succeed in school by meeting the challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards."

Purpose of Meeting





TITLE I FUNDS

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Set Aside:

Each district receiving more than \$500,000 in Title I Part A Funds is required to reserve at least one percent of its Title I funds to carry out parent and family engagement activities, including those described in the written policy section below.
